**Re: HB 1876 (Davis), ethics reform, supporting testimony by Public Citizen**

Dear Chairman Phelan and members of the committee:

Public Citizen appreciates the opportunity to testify for HB 1876. This bill includes ethics reform measures that have been recommended by the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) and/or previously passed the House or the General Investigating and Ethics Committee in previous sessions. In a 2015 assessment of ethics laws across the nation by the Center for Public Integrity, Texas received a D-.<sup>1</sup> Because Public Citizen supports strengthening our state's weak ethics laws, we support HB 1876.

Sections 1 and 2 of the bill prevent political contributions during special legislative sessions. This measure passed the General Investigation and Ethics Committee with 6 Ayes and 1 Absent as HB 19 during the 85<sup>th</sup> special session.

Section 3 permits the use of blue ink for certain political reports. This was recommendation 9 from the TEC in its report to the 86<sup>th</sup> legislature.<sup>2</sup>

Section 5 permit a person filing a non-electronic statement, registration, or report, with the TEC to use an unsworn declaration. This was recommendation 8 from the TEC's report to the 86<sup>th</sup> legislature.<sup>3</sup>

Section 6 closes the "revolving door" by preventing a former legislator or statewide office holder from registering as a lobbyist for one year. This measure passed the General Investigation and Ethics Committee with 6 Ayes and 1 Absent as HB 15 during the 85<sup>th</sup> special session.

Section 7 requires disclosure of conflicts of interest by to include members of a state agency governing board. This measure passed the General Investigation and Ethics Committee with 6 Ayes and 1 Absent as HB 18 during the 85<sup>th</sup> special session.
